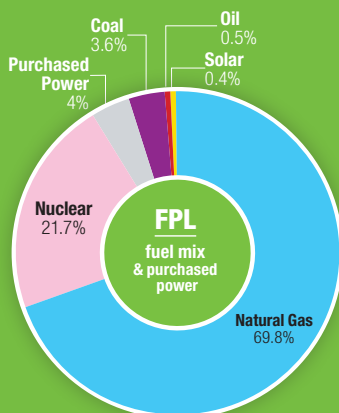

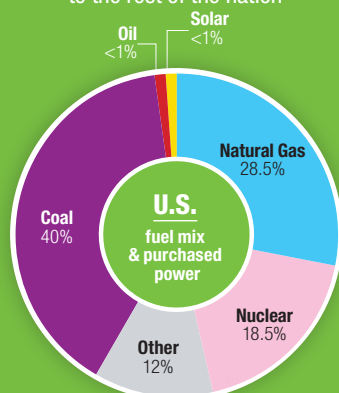
What powers Florida businesses

Storm charge adjustment

Effective as of Sept. 1, the storm charge rate on your bill decreased from \$1.76 to \$1.70 per 1,500 kWh for small, non-demand business customers. Adjusted up and down periodically during the year with Florida Public Service Commission approval, a routine storm charge adjustment helps pay for hurricane restoration costs associated with the 2004 and 2005 storms.
